Site Address: Bluebell Farm, Commonfield Lane, Barkham, RG40 4PR

Proposal: Alleged breach: Without planning permission, the material change of use

of the Land for the storage of caravans including associated fencing.

An appeal has been made to the Secretary of State against the decision of Wokingham Borough Council to issue an enforcement notice for the above breach.

Reasons for issuing the notice:

- i) It appears to the Council that the above breach of planning control has occurred within the last 10 years.
- ii) The storage of caravans and associated works represents an unacceptable encroachment of development into the open Countryside and is harmful to the immediate character of the Land as such the unauthorised development conflicts with the National Planning Policy Framework 2023 and Wokingham Borough Adopted Core Strategy 2010 Policies CP1, CP3 and CP11.
- iii) To remedy the breach of planning control.

The appellant has appealed against the notice on the following grounds:

- (a) That planning permission should be granted for what is alleged in the notice.
- (b) That the breach of control alleged in the enforcement notice has not occurred as a matter of fact.
- (c) That there has not been a breach of planning control.
- (f) The steps required to comply with the requirements of the notice are excessive, and lesser steps would overcome the objections.
- (g) The time given to comply with the notice is too short.

The appeal will be determined on the basis of a **written representations** procedure, as set out at: <u>Criteria for determining the procedure for planning, enforcement,</u> advertisement and discontinuance notice appeals - GOV.UK.

Interested persons who wish to make comments can do so on <u>Planning Inspectorate</u> by the 11th of April 2025. Please note that if comments are submitted after the deadline, the Inspector will not normally look at them and they will be returned. Your views will be disclosed to the parties to the appeal unless the representations are withdrawn before the 6 weeks deadline.
